Prague-Smíchov – Summary

The area of present day Smíchov, occupying the left bank of the Vltava River south of the Petřín Hill, was formed by the streams that flow in the western-eastern direction into the Vltava River and that sculpted the deep valleys.

The area of present day Smíchov has been continually occupied since the Neolithic period. Since the 14th century, the focal points of later urbanization, an older village Újezd and then a newly planted Smíchov, were located in a short distance from each other, in the plain not far from Vltava's bank, separated by the Motolský Stream. There were also homesteads scattered in the hills, and the landscape had for long centuries an agricultural character.

In the early modern period, the northern part of the present day cadaster of Smíchov, separated since the end of the 17th century from Prague's Malá Strana with a massive baroque fortification, was transformed into a recreation zone of the leading noble families, who built follies and villas with decorative gardens here. These recreation and representative complexes thus complemented – as they did in other metropolises – the structure of the settlements of the leading noble families. The original of Dientzenhofer's villa is the only one that remains to the present day, although only as a torso – it is known as Portheimka (named after the Porges of Portheim, family of entrepreneurs, who had purchased the complex in 1828.) These and other follies and gardens became social centers. Villa Bertramka serves as a good example from the end of the 18th century. It is well known thanks to visits by W. A. Mozart (in 1787 and in 1791). Later on, in the 1820s, the Kinsky family built a villa on the hillside of Petřín; it dominated the surrounding romantic park.

Two islands (Dětský and Cisařská louka) in the Vltava River are a part of the Smíchov cadaster. Smíchov's life was not as closely bound to the river as was the case of Podskali on the right bank – in spite of the existence of numerous mills and the Malostranská water work. However, without the adjacent river, Smíchov would never have in the 19th century become an industrial town.

The immediate vicinity of the metropolis and the close relationship that bound Smíchov to Prague influenced its formation in several different ways. The area of Smíchov, as well as the entire region of Prague, suffered significant damages several times in the course of the early modern period, especially during the siege of Prague and during repeated battles for the city (in 1611, in the course of the Thirty Year War, 1741–1742 as well as two years later, in 1757).

The 19th century brought a massive transformation: Smíchov became an industrial district. The growing importance of Smíchov was caused primarily by the development of textile, chemical and food industries. The most important operation in Smíchov, the factory making machines and wagons of František Ringhoffer, was founded later, in 1852. The brewery corporation, later called Staropramen, also developed successfully there. The rail road played an important role in the development of Smíchov. The train station of the Česká Západoňní Line was opened in 1862 as the foundation of a quickly growing complex of train station, which filled the entire southern portion of the cadaster. Smíchov's leaders began, since the end of the first third of the century systematically to build public buildings. The flat areas of Smíchov were filled with continuous, several story high blocks of buildings; Smíchov was gaining an urban character.

What is extraordinary, in comparison with the majority of urban settlements in the Czech Republic, is that Smíchov lacks an unequivocal city center. And even though three squares were formed in the course of the 19th century, only one of them was of a medieval origin (Kostelní/Arbesovo Square) and, what is more, after some hesitation that lasted decades, it was not chosen to be the main public space of the new suburb (town). The new center was placed in the vicinity of the new Catholic Church (built 1881–1885) and the town hall (a reconstructed older building near the north-south road, present day Nádražní and Štefánikova Streets) – the square was later called 14. října Square.

In the rugged terrain of the valleys of the the Motolský and Radlický Streams and, generally, in the more elevated areas, the building boom did not begin until after the creation of Czechoslovakia and after the creation of Greater Prague 1920/1922). The roads, especially those going in the north-south direction, starting from Újezdská Gate in the direction of Zbraslav and of Plzeň, branching off from the aforementioned road at the intersection U Anděla, were for centuries the main axes of the urban development of Smíchov. In the second half of the 20th century, however, the planned development of transport infrastructure threatened to extinguish extensive parts of the district. These area reclamations were, however, realized only in part. Smíchov retained its industrial character; it transformed to serving primarily residential and commercial-administrative functions only at the turn of the 20th century. The industrial complexes were replaced by distinctive multi-story buildings serving office-commercial functions in the central part of Smíchov. The block called Zlatý Anděl, which dominates the historical intersection, had become its symbol. In relation to the metro station (Anděl /Moskevská/ opened in 1985) and along with the adjacent public space, at the beginning of the 21st century, it fulfills the function of the actual center of Smíchov. In the context of all of Prague, Smíchov is important for its traffic function and is characterized as a residential and administrative-commercial district.

Smíchov had since 1838 been a suburb (which was in 1849 designated the site of the district helman) and since 1903 an independent town. In 1920 (effective in 1922) Smíchov became a part of Greater Prague. At the beginning of the 21st century, Smíchov is one of Prague's administrative districts; specifically, it is a part of Prague 5. In 2011, there were 33,172 inhabitants living on the area of 705.1 ha; the population density was 4,705 inhabitants per km². The local geographic name Smíchov comes probably from the personal name Smiech (which means laughter, gaiety), the name Smíchov, therefore, means belonging to Smiech (Smiechův) or to Smich (Smichův). However, different interpretations exist as well. In 1993, an urban protected zone (of 220 ha) was created in Smíchov; it includes all of central Smíchov, the Malostranský Cemetery, the Kinský Garden and others.

This reconstruction map depicts a network of roads and localizes residential elements in present-day Smíchov, which are divided according to the time of their origin. This reconstruction is subordinated to the understanding that the medieval village Nádražní, founded in 1386[!], extended along both sides of present-day Nádražní Street between present-day Plzeňská Street and the brewery. This concept is contrasted with the theory of Smíchov as a village located near the eastern front of Nádražní Street between Lidická Street and U Železničního mostu Street.

Prag-Smichov – Resümee

Der Raum des heutigen Smichov [früher deutsch Smichow, im weiteren Text sind in eckigen Klammern frühere deutsche Namen angeführt], sich am linken Moldauufer südlich von der Anhöhe Petřín [Laurenzberg] erstreckend, wurde durch Bäche geformt, die in westöstlicher Richtung in die Vltava [Moldau] fließen und tiefe Täler modellierten.

Das Gebiet des heutigen Smichov ist kontinuierlich bereits seit dem Neolithikum besiedelt. In der Ebene unweit des Moldauufers, vom Motolský potok [Moto-Bach] abgeteilt, befanden sich unweit voneinander im 14. Jahrhundert zwei Kernpunkte der späteren Urbanisierung – das ältere Dorf Újezd [Aujezd] und das damals neu ausgesetzte Smichov; auf den Hügeln standen zerstreute Anwesen und die Landschaft hatte über lange Jahrhunderte hinweg einen landwirtschaftlichen Charakter. In der frühen Neuzeit veränderte sich der nördliche Teil des heutigen Smichover Katasters, seit Ende des 17. Jahrhunderts von der Prager Kleinside durch eine mächtige Fortifikation getrennt, in ein Erholungsdomizil führender Adelsfamilien, die sich hier Lustschlösser und Villen mit Ziergärten errichteten. In vielen davon etablierte sich das Kultur- und Gesellschaftsleben. Die ursprüngliche Dientzenhofersche Villa als einzige, obwohl als Torso, steht bis heute – sie ist als Portheimka nach der Unternehmerfamilie Porges von Portheim benannt, die das Areal 1828 kaufte. Dieses und weitere Lustschlösser und Gärten wurden zu Gesellschaftsdomizilien. Ein Beispiel aus dem 18. Jahrhundert kann dank der Besuche von W. A. Mozart bei den Eheleuten Dusek (1787, 1791) das etwas höher gelegene Anwesen Bertramka sein. Seit den 20er Jahren des 19. Jahrhunderts wurde an den Petřín-Hängen im Auftrag der Familie Kinský eine Villa gebaut, die dem romantischen Park in der Umgebung dominiert.

Zum Smichover Kataster gehören auch zwei Inseln (Dětský und Cisařská louka: Kinderinsel und Kaiserswiese). Trotz der Existenz zahlreicher Mühlen und des Kleinseitner Wasserwerks war das Leben in Smichov nicht so unmittelbar zum Fluss gewendet, wie zum Beispiel in Podskali am rechten Moldauufer. Smichov würde aber nie zu einer Industriestadt, wenn der Fluss nicht so nah liege.

Die Lage in unmittelbarer Nachbarschaft von Prag bei wichtigen Verbindungswegen brachte jedoch nicht nur Vorteile. Das Gebiet von Smichov, genauso wie die ganze ländliche Prager Region, litt mehrmals im Laufe der Jahrhunderte während der Invasion der Passauer (1611) und erneut bei wiederholten Belagerungen und Eroberungen von Prag in der Zeit des Dreißigjährigen Krieges. Die ganze Prager Umgebung litt ziemlich in den Jahren 1741–1742 und dann zwei Jahre später, nicht weniger wurde sie während des Siebenjährigen Krieges (1757) betroffen.

Das 19. Jahrhundert brachte für Smichov eine grundlegende Veränderung, als es zu einem Industrieviertel ausgebaut wurde, wo die massive Urbanisierung einen wesentlichen Anstieg der Bevölkerung zur Folge hatte. Die wachsende Prestige von Smichov wurde besonders durch die Entwicklung der Textil-, chemischen und Lebensmittelindustrie hervorgerufen. Der später führende Smichover Betrieb, die Maschinen- und Waggonfabrik von Franz Ringhoffer, wurde 1852 gebaut. Erfolgreich entwickelte sich ferner die Aktienbrauerei, der spätere Staropramen. Eine bedeutende Rolle in der Entwicklung von Smichov spielte die Eisenbahn. Der Bahnhof der Böhmisches Westbahn wurde als Basis des schnell wachsenden Bahnhofareals 1862 eröffnet, das den ganzen Teil des südlichen Katasters einbezog. Die Smichover Repräsentanz begann hier seit Ende des ersten Jahrhundertdrittels systematisch öffentliche Gebäude zu bauen. Die ebenen Teile von Smichov wurden kontinuierlich mit mehrstöckigen Wohnhausblöcken bebaut und der Ort erhielt dadurch städtischen Charakter.

Die unmittelbare Nachbarschaft der Großstadt und enge Bündnisse, die Smichov mit Prag verknüpften, beeinflussten in vielen Richtungen seine Prägung. Nicht letztendlich ist im Vergleich mit den meisten städtischen Siedlungen in der Tschechischen Republik die Absenz von einem maßgebenden Zentrum bemerkenswert. Obwohl in Smichov im 19. Jahrhundert drei Marktplätze geschaffen wurden, war nur einer davon mittelalterlichen Ursprungs – Kostelní-Platz, heute Arbes-Platz [Kirchen-Platz, heute Arbes-Platz] – und darüber hinaus nach Jahrzehnte dauerndem Zögern wurde er nicht zu dem zukunftsweisenden öffentlichen Hauptplatz der neuen Vorstadt (Stadt) gewählt. Das neue Zentrum war in die Nähe der neuen katholischen Kirche (in den Jahren 1881–1885 gebaut) und des Rathauses (ein rekonstruiertes älteres Gebäude an der Nord-Süd-Kommunikation, die heutige Nádražní- und Štefánikstraße) gelegt. Der Platz wurde später als 14.-Oktober-Platz getauft.

Erst nach der Gründung der Tschechoslowakei und der Konstitution von Groß-Prag kam es in dem höhenunterschiedlichen Terrain in den Tälern der Bäche Motolský und Radlický und allgemein in den höher gelegenen Gebieten zu einer Baukonjunktur. Die Straße, besonders die nordsüdliche Verkehrsverbindung, aus dem Aujezder Tor hervorgehend und nach Zbraslav [Königsaa] führend, und die nach Plzeň [Pilsen] führende Straße, von der weiter erwähnten Kreuzung U Anděla [Zum Engel] abweigend, waren über Jahrhunderte hinweg die Achsen der Bauentwicklung von Smichov. In der zweiten Hälfte des 20. Jahrhunderts gefährdete jedoch die planmäßige Entwicklung von Verkehrsadern den Verbleib von großen Gebieten hiesiger Bauviertel. Diese flächenmäßigen Sanierungen wurden jedoch nur zum Teil verwirklicht. Fast über das ganze 20. Jahrhundert hinweg behielt sich Smichov den Industriecharakter und zum Wandel von der dominierenden Industrie zu einer Residenz- mit Handels- und Bürofunktion gelangte der Stadtteil erst am Umbruch des 20. und 21. Jahrhunderts.

Einen grundsätzlichen Wandel machte der Zentralteil von Smichov durch, wo die Industrieanlage die heutigen mehrstöckigen großdimensionierten Büro- und Geschäftsgebäude ersetzen. Zum Symbol gelangte der Hausblock Zlatý Anděl, der der historischen Kreuzung dominiert. Die Kreuzung mit der U-Bahnstation (1965 eröffnete Station Anděl /damals Moskevská/) und gemeinsam mit den benachbarten öffentlichen Gebäuden setzten sich zum tatsächlichen Mittelpunkt von Smichov zu Beginn des 21. Jahrhunderts durch. In Zusammenhängen mit Prag insgesamt hat Smichov die Bedeutung aus der Verkehrssicht und mit dem Residenz-, Büro- und Geschäftsviertel.

Smichov war seit 1838 eine Vorstadt (1849 zum Sitz der Bezirkshauptmannschaft bestimmt) und seit 1903 eine selbständige Stadt. Im Jahre 1920 (mit Gültigkeit ab 1922) wurde Smichov als Teil von Groß-Prag festgesetzt. Zu Beginn des 21. Jahrhunderts ist Smichov administrativ ein Bestandteil von Prag, konkret des Stadtteils Prag 5. Im Jahre 2011 lebten auf der Fläche von 705,1 ha 33 172 Einwohner, die Bevölkerungsdichte betrug 4 705 Einwohner pro 1 km². Der Ortsname Smichov wird von Personennamen Smich (Lachen, Belustigung) abgeleitet, der Name Smichov bedeutet also Smiechs (Smiechs) Besitz. Es bestehen jedoch noch andere Auslegungen. Im Jahre 1993 wurde auf dem Gebiet von Smichov eine städtische Denkmalzone im Ausmaß von 220 ha festgelegt, welche den ganzen Mittelteil von Smichov, den Kleinseitner Friedhof, den Kinský-Garten u. a. Flächen umfasst.
